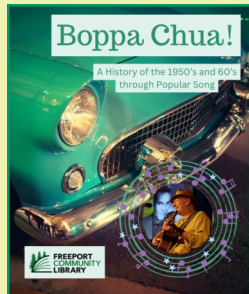
On Tuesday, July 9th, Town Hall and the Library will be closed from 12:00 PM—2:00 PM so all staff can attend training.

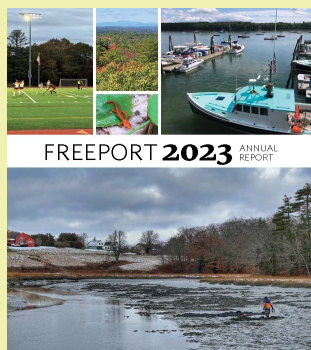
July Spice Club: Filé Powder
