****NEW Senior Property Tax Rebate Program****



If you have a primary residence in Freeport and are 65+ years old, you **may** qualify for the Town of Freeport's new Senior Property Tax Rebate Program. This program is for individuals who have lived in owned or rented homes, condominiums, and apartments in Freeport that meet the following criteria:

- Lived in an owned or rented unit or home in Freeport continuously for at least the last five years;
- Household assets, excluding the primary residence, of less than \$500,000; and
- Household income of 250% or less of the Federal Poverty Level (Household of 1 - \$37,650/ 2 - \$51,000)

Rebates range from \$300 - \$750 (however, they may be prorated if the rebates for all eligible applicants exceeds the available Program Funds).




