- ♦ EMERALD ASH BORER



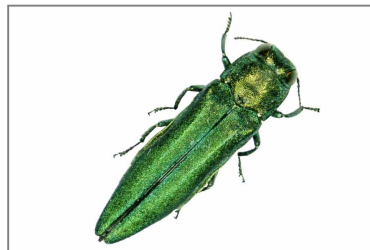
The *browntail moth* caterpillar has tiny poisonous hairs that cause dermatitis similar to poison ivy on sensitive individuals.
