#### Freeport Sustainability Series Presents: An update from the Governor's Climate Council How Maine is Leading the Charge Against Climate Change Monday, January 13<sup>th</sup>, 6:30-7:30 pm Freeport Community Center - 53 Depot St.

This event will cover how climate change is affecting Maine, introduce Maine's new Climate Council, and give Freeport residents tips on how they can engage with climate policy in the State.

Our speaker Cassaundra Rose is the Climate Council Coordinator with the Governor's Office of Policy Innovation and the Future. As a Senior Science Analyst, Cassaundra has managed a policy and communications program for the American Geosciences Institute. Cassaundra has more than ten years of academic climate research experience.

Daniel Kleban of Maine Beer Co., and a member of the Maine Climate Council, and Naomi Beal, Executive Director of passivhausMAINE and member of the Council's Buildings, Infrastructure, and Housing working group, will also give remarks.

# Winter Safety Tips from Freeport Public Safety

### Around the House:

- Clear roofs of excessive snow and ice buildup.
- Keep all chimneys and vents clear to prevent carbon monoxide from backing up into the building.
- Keep exits clear of snow so that occupants can leave safely in the event of a fire or emergency.
- Check on smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors, including batteries. Do not thaw pipes with an open flame.

#### On the Road:


- Slow Down: Driving too fast on wintry roads is the leading cause of crashes.
- Travel at a safe distance of at least 3 car lengths, leaving plenty of room to stop.
- Do not crowd slow moving maintenance&emergency vehicles.
- Do not use cruise control while driving in a storm.
- Do not overestimate the capabilities of your four-wheel drive vehicle.
- Clear all snow and ice from the vehicle prior to travel (Don't forget the roof!).
- Be aware of black ice on what appears to be bare pavement.
- Complete a safety check of your vehicle to include tires (for good traction) and lights (for good visibility).

# **REMINDER FOR DOG OWNERS!**

All dog licenses expire December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. You need to renew your dog license no later than January 31st of each year, or a late fee of \$25.00 per dog will be

charged. You may register at the Freeport Town Hall or online at: www.doglicensing.com.
