Town Manager's Report March 3, 2020

COVID-19 Update

Chief Jordan was here tonight to present a brief update on what Town officials are doing to educate themselves and prepare for any cases of COVID-19 in the region.

Compost Bins

Compost bins are still available for purchase at the Freeport Recycling Facility for \$55 per bin.

Sale of 20' Police Boat

Per Town policy, I am notifying the Town Council of the proposed sale of the 20' Maycraft center console Police boat. During last year's capital program discussion, we discussed retaining the 23' center cabin Harbormaster's boat, selling the 20' center console Police boat, and purchasing a smaller aluminum utility boat that could be useful in situations where the Harbormaster's boat was not the appropriate vehicle to use. When we were pricing out aluminum boats, we were offered \$8,000 trade in value on the 20' Police boat, which we passed on. We were more recently approached with an offer of a brokered sale from Casco Bay yacht, where the boat is stored, for \$15,000, of which the Town will net \$13,500, which I plan to accept.
