Town Manager's Report June 2nd, 2015

The Public works Department has scheduled installation of the berm and screening plantings at the end of Elm Street for the end of this week and beginning of next week. Construction and plantings are expected to take a few days. Total material cost is expected to be approximately \$1,000 for the berm and \$1,000 - \$1,500 for the trees.
