The Maine Forest Service projects high levels of browntail moth caterpillars in Freeport during 2016. **The hairs from these caterpillars can cause a severe rash and damage or kill trees.** This will be a general information presentation focusing on:

- * how to identify browntail moth caterpillars and overwintering webs;
- * how to prepare and control for browntail moth caterpillars;
- * precautions residents in affected areas should take.

Presenter: Charlene Donahue, Forest Entomologist, Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Maine Forest Service.

Town Manager's Report February 23, 2016

Public Works Department Updates – Roads posted: Due to the early thaw this year, the Public Works Department has posted certain Town roads effective Monday, February 22nd. The list of posted roads is available on our website at

www.freeportmaine.com. Please note one small change from last year – Holbrook Street will not be posted from Main Street to the High School, due to construction deliveries throughout the winter. Any non-routine heavy delivery requires a permit from the Public Works Department at 865-4461. Please remember that while road postings can be an inconvenience, they serve to protect the road from heavy loads during the early spring freeze thaw cycle. This helps our roads last longer, which in turn saves taxpayer dollars!

Retirement Announcements:

Chief Jerry Schofield has announced that he will be retiring as Freeport's Police Chief as of March 26th, 2016. Chief Schofield has been Freeport's Police Chief for twenty-eight years. Chief Schofield was hired in July of 1976 as a Patrol Officer, worked his way up the ranks serving as a Sergeant, Lieutenant, and in 1988 was appointed as Freeport's Police Chief. His thirty-nine years of service show an incredible commitment to the town and its residents. We are sad to see him go.

Chief Darrel Fournier has also announced that he will be retiring as of May 6th, 2016. He has a total of forty-two years in fire and rescue service, most of it in Freeport. He began his service in Freeport in 1970 and became Freeport's first full-time career Fire Chief in 1983 and served in that capacity until 1990. He was Waterville's Fire Chief until 1999, returning to Freeport in 2000 as Freeport's Fire Chief and Emergency Management Director. His forty-two years in fire and rescue service also show his commitment to the town, people and public service.
