This presentation was intended as a tool to assist the Town of Freeport's Council and management in understanding its financial operating results (the annual audit). Town Manager's Report October 18, 2016

Construction Update - South Street Sidewalk: The Public Works Department reports that this long awaited project is approximately 60% complete. We are awaiting final paving and final site cleanup and finishing touches, which are expected to be complete in the next two weeks.

Construction Update – South Freeport Village: This project is still on the schedule for this fall, although it has been pushed back further than expected.

Construction work and paving on Middle and Park Streets is expected to occur the week of 10/31/16.

Weather permitting, construction and paving of Main Street is expected to occur the week of 11/05/16.

Should temperatures not permit (temperatures below 45 deg. F), work on Main Street South Freeport will not begin until springtime.
