Trees provide improved air quality, storm water runoff interception and energy conservation while encouraging lower traffic speeds, increasing property values, mental health & creating a desirable place to live. Throughout the months of June and July, the Maine Forest Service's Project Canopy staff and teams of volunteers will be conducting an inventory of Freeport's public trees. Attendees will learn the value of urban trees, tree identification, how to measure trees and how to use the USDA Forest Service's state-of-the-art iTree software. Spring/Summer Fire Safety Tips: As spring is upon us and summer shouldn't (let's hope) be too far behind, Freeport Fire Rescue offers the following Fire Safety Tips: **Outdoor Cooking and Recreational Fires** These fires include the non-commercial burning of materials, other than rubbish for the purposes of preparing food or for pleasure, religious, ceremonial or similar purposes. The total fuel area may not exceed three (3) feet in diameter and two (2) feet in height. Paper or cardboard *Continued on page 2*

may be burned **as kindling only** in amounts necessary to ensure ignition of fires.

These fires do not require a permit but having one may keep us from responding to a report of "a fire in the area." Good sense needs to rule the day with wind speed and direction, environmental conditions (wet/dry), distance to combustibles, etc. needing to be factored in to a burn/no burn decision. These fires, like any outdoor burning, may be terminated for non-compliance with regulations or due to legitimate nuisance complaints.

Burning Permits must be obtained in order to have an open burn in your yard of leaves, brush, or scrap wood. You MAY NOT burn trash, or other illegal material. Burn Permits may be obtained for FREE on the day of the burn at the Public Safety Building 7 days a week from 8am to 4pm or online for a fee of \$7.

Remember: FIRE and IMPAIRMENT present a dangerous combination. Stay a safe distance from any fires and PLEASE keep the safety of children utmost in your mind.
