Changes in Town Government & Services

Freeport public buildings are closed to the public and have been restricted to as-needed/emergency access only. Residents have the ability to complete many regular transactions online. A list of online transactions can be found at the following website: https://www.freeportmaine.com/online-payments. If you need assistance with a Town service or function that is not available online, please contact the appropriate department at the following numbers (or by email), and we will attempt to complete your request remotely. Many employees will be working remotely and will have the ability to check their email and voice messages during that time, so please do not hesitate to contact us with any questions.

At this time the **Freeport Recycling Center** will remain open on its regular schedule. Employees have been ordered not to handle your materials, and to maintain appropriate distancing from customers for their safety. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience that this may cause. Additional guidelines for facility users will be posted at the entrance to the facility. We ask that you observe any temporary rules or guidelines that are posted at the facility.

By order of the Town Council, all **Town Council**, **Board**, **and Committee meetings have been cancelled** until at least 04/28/20.

Winslow Park Restrictions – Effective 3/27/20

In an effort to prevent overcrowding and the congregation of large groups within Winslow Park access to Winslow Park will be limited for day use until further notice.

The main park entrance past the gate house will be closed to vehicular traffic until further notice. Park users are directed to park at the gate house parking lot (by the boat ramp). If parking is available in this lot, visitors are welcome to enter the park. If this parking lot is full, the park is considered to be at capacity, and no further admission will be allowed. If the park is full, visitors are encouraged to return at another time.

Please keep in mind that weekend afternoons are particularly busy at the park, and we expect that access will be limited at these times due to high demand.

Within the park, the playground and group meeting areas will be closed until further notice. All visitors are required to maintain 10 foot spacing from everyone other than immediate family members. Visitors are encouraged to spread out throughout the park, and to avoid congregating heavily in any particular area of the park. If park staff witnesses violations of this policy, users may be asked to leave the park.

We understand that these restrictions may be inconvenient, however recent heavy crowds and gatherings of larger groups within the park have been observed by park staff. These crowds and gatherings are contrary to recommendations of the Maine CDC and the Governor's Office to maintain appropriate distance, and may endanger the health of other park users. We hope that these preventive steps will address these concerns, so that the park may remain open for people to use safely during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Vehicle Registrations Extended

Please be aware that the Secretary of State has stated that during this time of civil emergency, Motor vehicle and trailer registrations, including all temporary registrations and any fuel use decals that expire during the state of emergency will be extended. This applies to registrations issued by municipalities or the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, and also to temporary registrations issued by dealers. The State of Maine recognizes the need of individuals, families, and businesses for transportation, work and commerce during the emergency. These registrations can be renewed after the emergency ends.

Registrations issued by a municipality, including temporary registrations, are deemed extended until 30 days following the termination of the state of emergency pursuant to P.L. 2019, ch. 617, F-1, emergency laws approved by the Governor on March 18, 2020.

Other registrations, including temporary registrations, will be extended until 30 days following the termination of the state of emergency pursuant to the emergency provision of 29-A MRSA 405(4).

Remember that renewals can be done on line, and rest assured, the Maine State and local police have been notified of the extension on expired registrations as well as on inspections.

An urgent notice from the Town of Freeport, on behalf of our friends at the Freeport Sewer District:

We realize that recent shortages of toilet paper may lead to people needing to be creative with their use of bathroom products, but PLEASE do not flush products other than toilet paper down the toilet. Although some products such as wipes and napkins may be advertised as "flushable", they cannot be processed at the Freeport Sewer District pump stations. Heavier items such as paper towels, cloth towels, rags, and the like are NEVER flushable. Recent use of such items throughout Town has resulted in several emergency call-ins by Freeport Sewer District maintenance personnel in order to clear blockages and prevent sewer backups and overflows.

If we all do our part, we can keep the sewerage where it belongs... in the pipes and pump stations underground!
