Town Council & Police Department Forum

Tuesday, June 23, 2020 6:30 PM

In response to the national unrest surrounding police related incidents in other areas of the country, the Town of Freeport is scheduling a public forum/discussion to provide opportunities to start a dialogue between the Town Council, Police Department and the Community. The first portion of the forum will be an opportunity to educate officials and the public on current Freeport policing standards. This will include time to hear about current department policies and procedures; recruitment and hiring practices; training methods; equipment and its use; and to discuss how officers interact with citizens and the relationship our officers have with our community.

The second portion of the forum will consist of an opportunity for discussion, comments, and questions between community members and Town and Police Department officials. Because of limits on the number of active participants (limited to 100) due to Zoom teleconference technology, residents who may wish to speak during the forum are encouraged to preregister using the link found on the Town's Meeting Calendar on the Town's website at www.freeportmaine.com. Residents who only wish to watch the forum but not speak will be able to do so on cable channel 3, the Town's live streaming video service at fctv3.freeportmaine.com, or on the Town's Facebook page or YouTube channel.

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Freeport Responds to COVID-19 Impact on Freeport Businesses

COVID-19 Small Business Loan Program -The Town of Freeport, the Freeport Chamber of Commerce, Visit Freeport and FEDC have united to bring a loan program to Freeport businesses to support our business community. On May 19, the Freeport Town Council appropriated \$100,000 in TIF funds to establish Freeport's first revolving loan fund for small businesses and we are working to obtain additional funds from grants or private donations. A loan application and parameters have been developed which will provide financial assistance for overhead costs not covered in other COVID-19 response programs offered by traditional lending and state, federal and regional agencies. This loan program is one part of actions taken by the town organizations to combat the effects COVID-19 is having on our business community. The loan program has begun accepting applications for borrowers; the program outline and application is available on the Freeport town website at https://www.freeportmaine.com/home/news/covid-19small-business-loan-program. Temporary Activity Permits for expanding business activities outdoors and for temporary signage - On May 19, 2020, the Freeport Town Council adopted an Emergency Ordinance allowing for the "Temporary Suspension of Certain Ordinance Standards to Safely Accommodate Expanded Outdoor Business Activities due to COVID-19". A Temporary Activity Permit may be applied for as allowed by the Emergency Ordinance. All permits applied for under this Ordinance must comply with any guidelines included in the adopted language. All permits issued, as allowed by this Ordinance, will expire at such time the Ordinance expires (which is subject to repeal or extension by the Freeport Town Council).
