TRAFFIC NOTICE: On July 11th, MDOT started working on Rt. 1N, slip-lining existing structure. There will be times when Rt. 1 traffic will be down to one lane during construction from July 11-August 8 (flaggers will be present, but please be aware and allow extra time due to slower traffic).
