- 1. <u>Overview</u>:
 - The mission of the Freeport Housing Trust is to provide safe, decent and affordable housing opportunities for the lower and moderate-income households of Freeport.
 - Private, non-profit, charitable 501(c)(3) corporation, not a public housing authority.

- 2. <u>Housing Trust properties</u>:
 - 149 units of affordable rental housing in 7 properties (82 family and 67 senior).
 - FHT paid over \$102,000 in property taxes for FY 2018 (net of TIF).
 - The rental subsidy provided to residents of FHT properties amounts to over \$380,000 annually.
 - FHT properties include a mix of subsidized and market-rate units.
 - FHT also holds long-term affordability restrictions on 9 condominium units in Freeport and Durham.
- 3. Accomplishments during 2018:
 - Completed transition to new Executive Director, Matthew Peters.
 - Continuation of summer camp scholarship program with FCS.
 - Continuation of Emergency Rental Assistance Fund with Town.
- 4. <u>Plans for 2019</u>:
 - Begin planning refinance and addition to Varney Square to happen in 2021.
 - Complete acquisition of Quarry Ridge.
 - Complete installation of 99 kW photovoltaic arrays at Oakleaf and Brookside.
 - Continue collaboration with Town on Emergency Rental Assistance Fund.
 - Continue collaboration with FCS on Summer Camp Scholarship Program with \$10,000 donation.
- 5. <u>Housing Issues</u>:
 - The average occupancy rate for all FHT apartments for 2018 was 98%.
 - The Median Home Sale Price for Freeport in 2018 was \$401,000, which meant that 60% of households were able to afford the median home sale.
