- Per Tax assessor on Freeport solar panel data

- Solar properties are valued and can be exempted according to state law by the local Assessor based on its status on April 1 of each year.
- Properties are not broken down into commercial v. residential, although a different regulatory structure kicks in if a project is more than 5 megawatts in size. Most

installations in Town are of the single family service-type. We have notified the public via announcements at the Council level, by the Town Manager's bulletin, by the Town website and by mailers that we have sent out. In addition the local solar contractors use this exemption as a selling point, so pretty much all users are aware of it.

- As of this year's tax commitment, our office received 117 applications for exemption. We maintain an open file for applications as they come into our office, and have 15 more submitted so far to add for the coming tax year.
- The local assessor reports the exemption and valuations to the State on its Municipal Valuation Return. The benefit to the town is that it is reimbursed for 50% of the revenue lost due to the exemption, which will be \$16,500 this year.

• EPR, WASTE, RECYCLING, COMPOST: 10 min

Information about 2 remaining silver bullets from Adam Bliss:

Pick up times are: Mid-morning, usually between 9 and 10 a.m., but the schedule is determined by the hauler.

When they are full: Usually before pick-up, but it greatly depends how well, if at all, cardboard boxes are broken down. West Street is hauled four times per week, and Hunter Road is hauled three times per week. We hauled West Street five times per week during the holidays, including adding a second container.

Weights: 0.5 to 1 ton.

Contamination: As of June 2021, ecomaine only reports contamination levels above 25%. The Recycling Containers never exceed the 25% threshold, and the containers' estimated contamination is between 5 and 10%.

Options for adjusting pick up times: Limited because of haulers' abilities and shortage of Class B licensed drivers. We have inquired about weekend pick-ups, but we received a firm no.

At the center of its climate provisions, as passed by the House, are tax credits that make it cheaper to build solar, wind, nuclear and other low-carbon energy sources. The federal government would provide subsidies for consumers buying electric vehicles. Electric heat pumps energy-efficient alternatives to traditional air conditioning and heating would also be cheaper. And the bill would improve the infrastructure that enables those clean energy initiatives, funding more charging stations for electric vehicles and improving electric grids to support more solar and wind power.
