As you know, Freeport's municipal rebate program for energy-efficient equipment has not met expectations. We believe that two adjustments (1) an increase in the number of items covered and (2) an increase in the qualifying income level required for participationwill improve program participation.

Following is information about South Portland's program obtained by Bob Stevens. We would propose increasing the number of items covered to include all those covered by South Portland and increasing the qualifying income level up to 100% of Area Median Income (e.g., below \$111,700 for a family of 4).

SOUTH PORTLAND, Maine – After a hugely successful campaign, more than **\$262,000** in rebates were given out during Electrify Everything!, South Portland's beneficial electrification program. Aimed at assisting low- and moderate income residents with adopting more efficient, cleaner electric technologies for their homes, transportation, and lawncare equipment, the program funded rebates for **317** South Portland households in just 10 months! Electrify Everything! was funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

The Highlights

Launched on September 1, 2022 at a time when heating fuel and gasoline prices were at record highs, South Portland's Electrify Everything!'s design was simple; help low- and moderate income residents adopt more efficient, cleaner electric technologies to help save money and feel more comfortable in their homes. Electrify Everything! also helped South Portland to reduce community-wide greenhouse gas emissions through beneficial electrification. The City provided rebates on electric vehicles, electric lawn care equipment, e-bikes, heating and cooling systems, and home weatherization. South Portland residents with a household income up to 100% of Area Median Income (e.g. below \$111,700 for a family of 4) were eligible to receive up to \$2,000 per household in rebates, on top of other federal and state (Efficiency Maine) rebates. In total 317 South Portland households took advantage of the rebate program for the installation or purchase of the following equipment: Air Source Heat Pumps: 92 Hot Water Heat Pumps: 19 Air Sealing: 1 Insulation: 23 Electric Vehicles (all-electric and plug-in hybrids): 13 Electric Bikes: 89 Electric Lawn Mowers: 132 Electric Leaf Blowers: 35 Electric String Trimmers: 37

In South Portland, 19% of greenhouse gas (ghg) emissions originate in our residential buildings. 32% come from transportation - totaling more than 50% of our community-wide ghg emissions. Our climate action plan, *One Climate Future*, identifies beneficial electrification, or the replacement of fossil fuels with electricity in a way that reduces overall emissions and energy costs, as a key strategy. By offering rebates directly to residents for electric home heating systems, vehicles, and lawncare equipment – paired with an electric grid that is increasingly run on renewables – we have made significant progress towards becoming carbon neutral.

Although Electrify Everything! has ended at this time, ongoing projects and other rebates available at the state and federal levels will continue to help us reach our goal of carbon neutrality by 2050.
