RE: Commercial Shellfish Harvesting License Fee Deferral

According to section 32-601 of the Freeport Shellfish Conservation Ordinance, the fee for renewal Commercial Shellfish Licenses (\$430) is split into two payments, with one half payable by the end of April, and one half payable by the end of May, prior to the issuance of renewal licenses in June.

Harbormaster/Marine Resource Officer Charlie Tetreau has received several requests to defer the payment of the first half of the license renewal fee until the end of May. Additionally, a smaller number of requests have been made to the Town to waive licensing fees altogether. After reviewing the licensing process, Harbormaster/MRCO Tetreau is recommending that the Town Council take action to defer payment of the first installment (50%) payment until the end of May, to run concurrent with the second installment (50%) payment deadline. I agree with his recommendation.

Harbormaster/MRCO Tetreau did discuss this possibility with officials at Maine Department of Marine Resources (DMR), who ultimately delegate shellfish licensing authority to the Town. The initial reaction from DMR was that this should not create a problem, but he is still waiting on confirmation in writing from DMR that this would be acceptable. Therefore, if the Council does decide to take action on this request, any order to do so should be contingent on approval by Maine DMR.

This action would not affect the payment schedule for new Commercial licenses, which would remain due in June.

We suggest the following order for consideration if the Council is so inclined:

BE IT ORDERED: That the requirement contained in Freeport Shellfish Conservation Ordinance Chapter 32, Section 601(E) specifying that a 50% payment (totaling \$215) be submitted along with application for a renewal commercial license be suspended for calendar year 2020. Instead, full payment of \$430 will before the end of May, when the second 50% payment would otherwise be due. This order will become effective only after written approval from the Maine Department of Marine Resources.
