## **Proposed New Actions:**

• (5.1.7) Launch an accessible, widespread, and branded outreach campaign for homes and businesses on opportunities to reduce, reuse, and recycle materials.

## Proposed Amendments to Existing Actions:

- (1.1.1) new Implementation note
  - Use Maine Clean Communities Municipal EV planning resource
  - Complement policy with streamlined permitting and inspection processes
- (2.2.1) Update zoning and develop dedicated funding to enable high-density development, attainable housing, and mixed use areas in line with Smart Growth principles and transit-oriented development (TOD).
- (3.1.1) new Implementation note
  - Track the Home Energy Score program once released by the State and explore ways to increase transparency of efficiency for residential and multifamily buildings at point of sale
- (3.1.2) new Implementation note
  - Promote existing Residential PACE program
- (3.1.3) Pilot an energy benchmarking program with businesses that could phase into an Energy Benchmarking Policy or voluntary initiative, and promote commercial energy audits and deep-energy retrofits.
- (3.1.3) New implementation note
  - Evaluate mechanisms for data transparency with consumers/residents
- (3.2.1) Develop phased-in requirements paired with incentives for on-site renewable energy generation and storage, EV-ready, renewably-powered heating, and high efficiency standards in new construction and major renovations.

  - Explore Sustainability Checklist and performance-based zoning for flexible requirements in mitigation and adaptation building factors
  - Phase in new stretch code iterations starting with incentives for opting-in

  - Enhance staff capacity to pursue funding and complete stream crossing impoundment upgrades
- 6.1.2 new implementation note
  - Explore adopting MS4 standards to apply town-wide
- (8.3.2) new Implementation note
  - Aim to restrict rebuilding in floodplain areas or areas that will regularly flood given climate projections
