II. Welcoming Comments	<ul> <li>3/2/2021 meeting postponed to 3/10/2021 due to power outage.</li> <li>Bridge bond referendum vote passed with approximately 801 (79%) in favor, and 215 (21%) opposed.</li> <li>Reviewed agenda and welcomed guest speakers.</li> </ul>	Informational only, no vote.
III. Wayfinding Signs	<ul> <li>Kelly Edwards, Executive Director, Visit Freeport, and Jay Paulus, The British Goods, to discuss wayfinding signage in Freeport.</li> <li>Introduction by Kelly Edwards</li> <li>Presentation by Jay Paulus</li> <li>Better signage was a common theme from business owners and visitors for directions around the Village.</li> <li>An initial informal audit conducted shows Freeport has a nice program in place</li> <li>Signage programs can occur in phases, with implementation beginning in as little as 18 months</li> <li>Wayfinding signs are the center of sign programs</li> <li>Wayfinding signs should be integrated into the work that Principle group is conducting.</li> <li>Wayfinding signs are within the purview of the CSC.</li> <li>The existing signage program feels like it started but never finished the project but then was added on to.</li> <li>Ordinances would need to be evaluated and then consulted with Maine DOT.</li> </ul>	Informational only, no vote.



		<ul> <li>Signage must address accessibility, particularly those with low vision.</li> <li>Connect Freeport initiative, and Activity Centers should be implemented into the sign program.</li> <li>Downtown Vision group and the street gang should be incorporated into the CSC work, such as trail projects.</li> <li>Visit Freeport to meet with Principle Group regarding the Wayfinding Signs plan.</li> <li>The presentation shared with FEDC.</li> </ul>	
IV.	Workplan Review	<ul> <li>Priority projects are Mallett Drive CSC and Connection from Yarmouth to Downtown. Projects are tied to funding opportunities and work identified by the ALC.</li> <li>Active Living Committee to explore the planning component for connection from Pine Tree Academy to Hedgehog Mountain. Liz Macdonald to lead the Pine Tree Academy to Hedgehog connection project.</li> <li>Phil Wagner to lead the Taxi parking stand on Main Street project.</li> <li>Doug Leland, Sally Walsh, and Greg Michaud to meet to discuss questions regarding the Lower Main Street planting project.</li> <li>The railroad bridge on Lower Main Street is now on the Maine DOT's 3-year workplan.</li> <li>Develop a central website for hosting CSC documents. A website would improve communications between the CSC, new members, and residents.</li> <li>Liz Macdonald motioned to move the four inactive Workplan projects to active status; motion seconded by Councilor Reighley; motion passed unanimously, 8-0 (Barbara Guffman left early).</li> </ul>	Motion passed.
