Doug Leland gave an update on the Route One South MUP. The solar farm easement will be on the parcel's west border, and a trail already exists there. He also has a call into the consultant requesting an easement on the parking lot that borders Route 1. <br> E. Adam gave an update on the Cousin's River Bridge MUP.
