

VI.	General Updates	 Construction on the Desert Road Bridge has started. Maine DOT had promised to ensure two lanes remain open, but that hasn't happened. Sally suggested that Complete Streets inform citizens of what to expect as the construction continues - Greg agreed. Adam pulled up a conceptual plan to show what would happen, but it wasn't updated to show a 12-foot MUP since we only have the Conceptual Plan. 	Informational only, no vote.	



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	 MDOT is supposed to update the Town every 30 days, but they're not. Andy Seymour speculated that they're not ready yet. Adam sent the Cousins River Bridge design to Maine DOT a couple of weeks ago, and he wants them to weigh in on the physical barrier. Lower Main Street: Greg, Adam, and Andy Spaulding met with Maine DOT to discuss the railroad overpass. Maine DOT wants a master plan so it can formulate a cost-sharing scenario. Adam will email them the Downtown Vision Plan so they can see town support for bike/ped infrastructure. Agenda topic for next time: The path from Desert Road Bridge to the Railroad Bridge and up through Town. The grant proposal process group met recently and went through the RAISE grant, which is part of the Biden signed infrastructure plan. There are seven major categories, and the group tried to determine their ability as a group to address them. Mostly, they think they could do a pretty good job. On May 18, 2022, Sally is attending a workshop for submitting a common application for grants. She'll let us know what she finds. Cathy Cyrvoff applied for ten benches at Town Hall and five at Oak Leaf Housing, and she is waiting to hear back. She suggested having a repository for grants. A new Economic Development Director, Brett Richardson, was recently hired, and Adam will invite him to the next Complete Streets Committee meeting. He has experience in grant writing and is taking the lead on submitting a T-MOBILE grant for town improvements. Another grant, the Village Partnership Initiative, is available and should be on the radar of the grant writing team. Phil asked if the Breeze bus stop could be moved, and the bus blocks the line of sight for anyone taking a left or right from Bow Street onto Main Street. Phil asked Earl if we could put signs on telephone poles, and Earl said that CMP frowns on it.


Freeport Downtown: Trails and Paths. Downtown as Trailhead - Freeport, ME


