Referendum Items:

Chair Soley noted that there will be an election on June 13 where Freeport voters will be asked to vote on three referendum questions. #1 is for \$500,000 to purchase land for open space. #2 is to replace the recycling building at the landfill and build a new transfer station at the landfill. #3 is to replace the Burnett Road Bridge. Mr. Olmstead explained what will take place if #2 and #3 are not passed by the voters. Discussion followed.

Discussion on Condition of the Sidewalk Plow/Sweeper:

Mr. Olmstead explained that this is a 1984 unit that was scheduled to be replaced next year. To avoid spending over \$5,000 in repairs to keep it going another year, he would like to replace it early and avoid spending the repair money. He has an estimate of \$49,766 for the machine but attachments may be necessary. The money will come out of TIF money. He asked for consensus to go out to get bids on the new machine as well as attachments. Councilors concurred.

Other:

Councilor Arsenault explained why he voted as he did tonight. During his lobbying, he was asked to act as a mediator between the School and the Council to compromise and offer some alternatives. In the interim weeks that passed, he felt that he came up with a compromise but when he approached the School Board, he was told that there was no compromising, it was either all or nothing. It left him in a very awkward position in the middle. The situation left him with no alternative but to vote as he did tonight and he would like the record to reflect this.

Councilor Mann and Campbell complimented Councilor Arsenault on his hard work.

Councilor Beaulieu noted that the Family Motor Coach Conference is coming August 16-20 and information was included in everyone's packets. She asked Councilors to look the information over. Somewhere between 5,000-7,500 people may be visiting each day and Councilor Beaulieu is working hard to ensure that they have a pleasant experience. Maine Line Buses will be bringing people in.

New Bicycle Committee:

Chair Soley indicated that a new committee has been formed and his wife is a member.

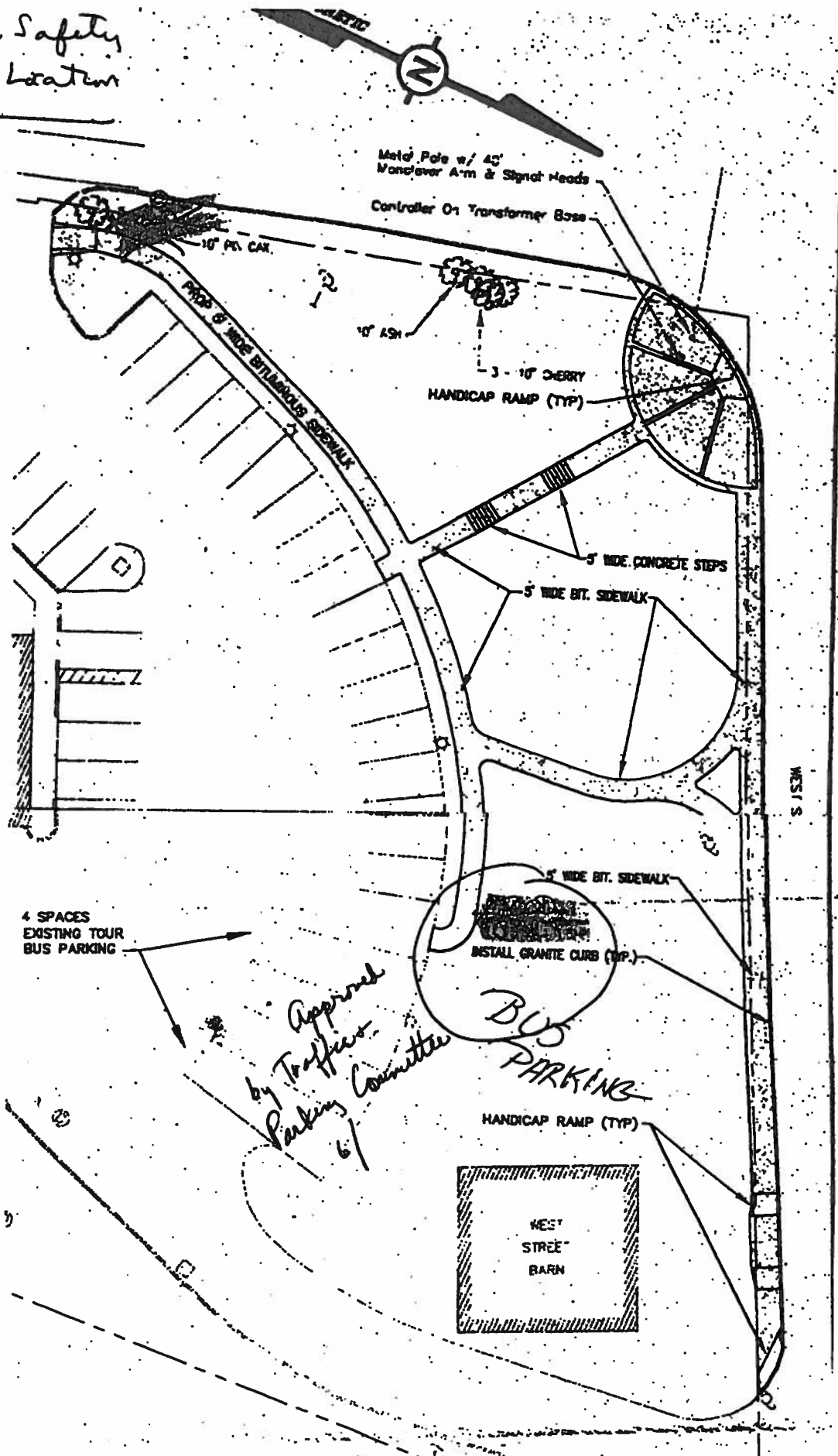
CHAPTER 43

Section 43-203 General Provisions

- ~~3. The right of way at the southerly corner of Mill Street and Depot Street, Map 10, Lot 24, shall be reserved for use by a Freeport school group during the period from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Each year a license shall be granted to a qualified Freeport school organization during this period by the Licensing Board. Revenues raised during this period shall be used for school related purposes. During the period from the day after Labor Day to Memorial Day, a license to use the space shall be issued to a qualified Freeport public service, school or municipal group on a first come first serve weekly basis by the Town Clerk. The Licensee must follow all provisions of the Ordinance except no fees or proof of insurance shall be required.~~

3. The Public Safety Building site located at 4 Main Street (Map 9, Lot 16) shall be reserved for use by the Freeport Fire and Rescue Companies. The Licensee must follow all provisions of the Ordinance except no fees or proof of insurance shall be required. No cart or related items may be placed in parking spaces or the park area on the corner of Main and West Streets.
