Attorney James Palmer made a brief presentation for the request of a water main extension for the new Middle School; the Site Plan has been approved by the Board of Appeals, however, the Planning Board approved with a condition that the school run a loop from the 8 inch water main on Pleasant Street to connect to a 10 inch water main located somewhere on Maple Avenue; the Fire Chief of Freeport was concerned about the water flow pressure; the running of a water main extension is not within the school's budget; the State will not pay for the cost of the main; the State has approved the complete project; Chief Fournier explained he feels there is not adequate water flow to protect the school; \$25,000 is the rough estimated figure without ledge for the cost of this water main; Council agreed to put this item on the next regular agenda which is March 13, 1984; Fire Chief Fournier suggested that the Army Corps of Engineers be contacted to work on this project.

Joseph Downey brought to the attention of the Council code violations against Joseph Saunders and the action he has taken; an occupancy permit was issued in Oct. 1983 with little review; Mr. Saunders wanted to move into the ground floor; he was granted a certificate of occupancy for the basement store which was to be in effect for 90 days only assuming that the code violations which had been brought out to him would be taken care of and corrected; Mr. Saunders was told that no further tenancies would occur without obtaining a certificate of occupancy; in the meantime, White Stag and Warnaco Inc. were opened without obtaining any certificates of occupancy; Mr. Downey requested that the Codes Enforcement Officer close down the stores and assess fines until a compliance is made by Mr. Saunders; Mr. Downey posted a "stop work order" on the building, this date - February 21; Fire Chief Fournier agrees there are code violations; Mr. Saunders has been in violation by not requesting any "Certificate of Occupancy" on either of the two stores; Council agreed that the Codes Enforcement Officer meet with Mr. Saunders and negotiate regarding the fines and permits and back Mr. Downey in his decision.

AMENDMENT TO THE FREEPORT TRAFFIC ORDINANCE

The Town of Freeport Hereby Ordains - That the following amendment be made to the Town of Freeport Traffic Ordinance.

## Article II Section 22

The Police Department may cause any vehicle parked for a period of twenty-four (24) or more consecutive hours on a public way in violation of the parking provisions of the Traffic Ordinance to be removed from the street at the expense of the registered owner of such vehicle(s).

The Town of Freeport Hereby Ordains -That a sum not to exceed \$16,400.00 is hereby appropriated for the purpose of funding the Town's share of installing a water main extension on Royal Avenue at Royal Oaks, and to meet said appropriation, the Chairman of the Town Council and the Town Treasurer are authorized to issue general obligation securities of the Town of Freeport in a total principal amount not to exceed \$16,400.00, and the discretion to fix the date, maturities, denomination, interest rate, place of payment, forms and other details of said securities including execution and delivery of said securities on behalf of the Town of Freeport is delegated to the Chairman of the Town Council and the Town Treasurer.
