A brief discussion followed on the hydrant rental request from the South Freeport Water District; Mr. Olmstead explained that a new hydrant was installed on Pine Street; cost is \$14.72 per month or \$176.69 per year; if Council approved this, it would cost roughly \$60 this fiscal year; there would be a slight overdraft in the account budgeted for - no more than \$60; Council approved the rental.

Town Manager Olmstead led a discussion on a DEP proposal to haul soil to the Freeport Landfill; he received a call from Hank Aho asking if the Council would have an interest in accepting contaminated soil from the Town of Gray; there was an oil spill and it's contaminated with #6 oil; this is to be used as cover material at the landfill; there's roughly 1,000 yards of material at 30 cents a yard; Council felt it was not their wish to dump this soil at the landfill.

Mr. Olmstead stated that David Thompson is the newly elected Chairman of the Traffic-Parking Committee; a brief discussion followed: grandfathered businesses should comply with the present parking requirements, Council should be encouraged to develop the Magno lot, Council should look at some other sites to acquire more property for parking areas, there's a demand for surface parking, there are suggestions for a public garage, Council does not want to see much tax dollars pay for the parking - they would want merchants to pay for the parking areas, the possibility of paving other than with asphalt, possibly using Bow Street Park as a parking area, granting a special tax assessment, expansion of US Route 1 south. The Council has invited the Planning Board to a joint meeting on January 22.

Barbara McGivaren, Chairperson of the Special Projects Committee, gave a brief report; a meeting was held on December 6; we discussed the future and past of Winslow Park - we need more accessability to the public - their suggestions are renovating the farmhouse, relocating the storage area to another facility, maintenance of the building, a policy on the rental of the Harb Cottage, more youth activities plus looking over the Master Plan again.

Dale Olmstead discussed street lights: He's had requests from merchants in the VC Zone as well as residents to switch from incandescent lights to sodium lights; James Collins and Dale surveyed the area and the lights could be corrected by having the present 10 incandescent lights replaced with 6 sodium lights; the cost will be a wash.

Dale Olmstead had received a letter from Department of Transportation regarding the signal light by the Municipal Building:

The letter states there are no State funds at this time; the cost is between \$8,000-15,000 depending on the type of light to be installed; they will refer this in their next budget; Council wished to wait.

Barbara McGivaren stated that a resident Diane Dennison wished to address the Council: Mrs. Dennison wished the Council to change the Traffic Ordinance to make Mallet Drive "no parking" from 6 AM to 6 PM; the Ordinance Committee will consider this request.

Vaughndella Curtis wanted to know where Agendas are posted; Town Manager Olmstead read a letter addressed to Art Ross with a copy to the Council Chairperson stating the various places.

Chairperson Palmer reminded the councilors who have not passed in their "goals and objectives" to please do so.

## TO THE FREEPORT ZONING ORDINANCE

# Section 521. Fire and Explosive Hazards

A. Any building or structure requiring site review shall have a sprinkler system or a fire suppression system meeting requirements of the Freeport Fire Chief. The fire alarm system would comply with the breeport Alarm Ordinance with a tie-in to the Freeport Fire Dispatch Center. When access to or within a structure or an area is unduly difficult because of secured openings or where immediate access is necessary for life-saving or fire-fighting purposes, the key box will be installed in an accessible location designated by the Fire Chief. The key box shall be a type approved by the Fire Chief and shall contain keys to gain necessary access as required by the Fire Chief. The key box will be connected to a local fire alarm that will summon the Fire Department when the box is opened or tampered with. The alarm will be transmitted to the Fire Department Dispatch Center.

Redesignate Sections A, B and C to be B, C and D respectively.
