- Councilor Nelson passed a portfolio around for councilors to look at regarding awards that Morse School and Middle School had received.
- Acting Chairperson Hartnett received a phone call from Fred Palmer regarding the Cable TV Regulatory Board; a suggestion has been made to use Gail Wright, a full time staff person, as a coordinator for the cable tv programs and utilizing Community Education people; a workshop with the Council has been requested; Town Manager Olmstead stated March 24 seemed a good date for Council, Community Education and Cable TV Board to meet with Fred Palmer.
- Acting Chairperson Hartnett received a call from Neal Novak who offered his assistance in getting the best deal for the . 3. town as far as the old Middle School insurance settlement; councilors felt that the town's insurance agent would act in the town's favor and were confortable with him.
 - Town Manager Olmstead notified the Council that there were some "housekeeping" items to take care of for codifying the town ordinances; hopefully, by the end of March, there would be a complete codified document listing all the ordinances for Council to vote on.

Other Business continued -

- 5. Town Clerk Wescott notified the Council of the six peddler spots, which are: front of Bartol Library, front of Mobil sign, front of LL Bean sign, front of Key Bank, and corner front of Frye Boots - all on Main Street, with spot six being the corner of Depot and Mill Streets.
- 6. Councilor Grady mentioned that Traffic & Parking Committee should be coming up with some good suggestions to alleviate many of the parking problems; he emphasized they were a good group to be working with.
