Town Manager Dale Olmstead was requested to read the following two letters into the Minutes:

"To Freeport Town Council Freeport, Maine 04032

The B. H. Bartol Library Board of Trustees accepts the proposal of the Freeport Traffic and Parking Committee with the following conditions:

Five (5) parking places adjacent to the Library in back of the Mobil Station with a 4 foot wide lighted walkway with adequate Library Parking Only signs to the existing main entrance of Nathan Nye Street.

Three (3) parking spaces on the Left of Nathan Nye Street with 1 marked for Parking for the Handicapped. These spaces to be marked with Library Parking Only signs and will be available if Nathan Nye traffic becomes right turn only.

Six (6) lined parking places on the Left in the existing Library Parking Lot with a barrier separating it from the planned thru-way to the Historical and Municipal Parking Lots on Howard Place. This lot must have Library Parking Only signs and proper drainage.

It is our understanding that L.L. Bean, Inc., will provide parking attendant coverage for the five parking spaces at the rear of the Library Building and the six spaces in our existing lot.

Dear Dale:

The purpose of this letter is to indicate L.L. Bean, Inc.'s willingness to provide four parking spaces in our parking lot located between Morse Street and Nathan Nye Street for use by the Freeport Library Patrons. The four spaces would be located in the Southeast Corner of our lot immediately adjacent to the West Wall of the Library Building.

Our willingness to provide these spaces is the result of the work of the Freeport Traffic and Parking Committee. As you know, the Committee has recommended to the Council that the Town (1) convert the old Middle School Property into a Municipal Parking Lot, and (2) integrate that lot with the parking lots behind the Lobster Cooker and the Historical Society Buildings and with the L.L. Bean Main Parking Lot. To integrate these four lots, the Town will need to build a one-way road from Nathan Nye Street to School Lane to basically connect the four parking lots noted.

L.L. Bean letter continued -

The roadway between Nathan Nye and School Lane will utilize a portion of the current Library Parking Lot and will result in loss of some six parking spaces for the Freeport Library. In order to make up this loss of parking for the Library, the Town will provide some on-street parking adjacent to the Library and L.L. Bean will provide four spaces in its parking lot behind the Library.

These spaces are being provided to the Library on the understanding that the four spaces will still be counted as L.L. Bean Parking whenever the Town evaluates the parking requirements for the L.L. Bean Retail Store.

L.L. Bean is strongly supportive of the work of the Freeport Traffic and Parking Committee. We believe that the proposal to convert the Middle School Lot to a parking lot and to integrate the four lots between Morse Street and School Lane will have a major, positive impact on the Town's parking and traffic problems. We genuinely appreciate the support of the Town and all of the parties involved in this effort. We look forward to an improved parking and traffic situation in the summer of 1987.

- 1. John Arsenault was concerned that he filled out an application stating he was interested in serving on the Coastal Waters & had no feed back; Council explained no citizen is guaranteed a spot on any board or commission just because they fill out this form; the vacancy was not yet determined; in the future acknowledgement would be sent out to interested citizens letting them know the form had been received.
- 2. Councilors reported on their respective district meetings: William Grady, District 1 -Approximately 12-15 people attended; main concerns were about the water company, taxes and the budget; it was a successful meeting, lasting approximately 2 hours; Mr. Grady welcomes more.

William Ormsby, District 2 Twenty-six people attended; their main concerns were taxes &the way land is valued.

Hugh Phelps, District 3 - About 20-25 people attended; their main aggrevations were taxes, public access, street lights & signs; a suggestion was made to implement design review in South Freeport.

Robert Hartnett, District 4 He was disappointed by the turn out, approximately 4 people attended, eliminating the school members, the press and the councilors; hopefully, more people will attend in the future. Their concerns were taxes.

Chairperson Bonney attended all the meetings and felt they were beneficial for all.

- 3. The petition to discontinue a street light on Pleasant Hill Road will be put on a future agenda to schedule a public hearing.
- 4. Report from the Ordinance Committee:

 Chairman Hartnett reported that the Committee will be recommending parking at the High School and Coffin's Loop; the Committee will study parking on Main Street from School to Bow Streets and will recommend a handicapped parking space in front of the Congregational Church these items will be forthcoming on a May Agenda.

Councilor Ormsby is excused at 9:54 P.M. from the Meeting

- 5. Town Manager received a request from the L.L. Bean Race Director to use Bow Street Park for their July 4 activities; Council gave their concensus.
- 6. Councilor Hartnett mentioned an ad regarding "productivity of employees; and requested the Town Manager put a copy in each councilor's packet.
- 7. Councilor Nelson mentioned that Maine Municipal Association is willing to sponsor and run a Senate District Meeting to inform people of tax reform at the State level; Kay Rand will send out the invitations once a date has been established and will also pick a speaker; Council tentatively selected May 18 or June 1 as possible dates.
- 8. Councilor Nelson invited councilors to attend a meeting the next night regarding the South American problem.
- 9. Town Manager informed the Council that the State of Maine is offering to the Town as a first refusal a parcel of land off I-95 that once was used as a picnic area; it is approximately 6.2 acres and the State is asking \$900,000.00; they will offer it to other towns if Freeport is not interested; the Town Assessor has stated it is over valued; Council decided they are not interested in this piece of land.
