Thereafter, we would like the art teacher and the guidance councilor to make the choice based on academic performance in the arts and crafts field and financial need.

To insure the award is put to the best possible usage, it has been determined to give the recipient a congratulatory card at graduation with the notation that the money will be given to them upon completion of their first semester.

Since there is insufficient time to accrue any interest for the award this year, I personally will donate \$300.00 for the June graduation presentation.

1. Discussion of one-half ton hoist: Town Manager Olmstead explained that at the last Council meeting the parties involved with the selection of the hoist stated they had monies left over toward the purchase of the 1/2 ton hoist and Council would only have to come up with between \$400-500 of expenses to make the difference of the \$900 purchase; now the price for a one-half ton hoist is \$1,350 - there is only \$200 available for the purchase from the interested parties and Council now has a deficit of \$1,150 to come up with; Council expressed much frustration at how events had manifested itself at the wharf and felt that the fishermen were the ones getting the short change, when, in fact, they had been the major issue in obtaining a hoist at the wharf; Council concensus was that the fishermen should have the one-half ton hoist.

Moved and Seconded - To bring up an item not on the printed Agenda. (Councilors Paterson & Stevens)

Moved and Seconded - That the Town Manager be authorized to expend up to \$1,500.00 from the Miscellaneous and Contingency Account for the purchase of a one-half ton hoist.
