Councilor Mann raised concern re: need for repair of concrete at Middle School.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

1. UPDATE ON MDOT ROAD TURNBACK AND ROAD CONDITIONS.

Manager Olmstead provided a brief history of this issue; the State establishing "Compact Zones" with communities exceeding populations over 6,000, former commissioner of DOT, Dana Connors' agreement of turning back roads to the towns in acceptable condition, State statute not defining "maintenance", potential increase to Town budget (an estimated \$100,000 adjustment), State's position on these roads not changing., need to bring these roads into acceptable condition before turning these roads over to the Town, etc.

Peter Tubbs provided an overview of the current conditions of the roads in question and costs to bring them into acceptable condition. He stated that the RSMS Management System to assess the pavement surface conditions of roadways; he stated that this system is not the same that the State uses to its roads, but it is an acceptable method of assessment.

Next defined were the structural problems on each road; the study showed that the roads are in a severely deteriorating condition. Mr. Tubbs then defined the costs to reconstruct these roads.

Discussion followed re: frost heave on Carriage Road, bike trails, estimated costs for repairs/upgrade \$3 million, Standish and Buxton's stand of not maintaining their roads scheduled for turnback, liability risk/safety, need to review statutes, need for emergency legislation, possible alternatives, need to educate people on this issue, etc.

2. DISCUSSION ON MARQUIS ROAD PAVING. Manager Olmstead provided the status on this location.

Discussion followed re: big dip at the bottom of the road, gravel VS. paving - which is more costly to maintain; status of Old Brunswick Road, etc.

3. Letter from Brian Maxwell re: leasing Library Parking Lot for two to three tent sales this summer.
