FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS: TO WAIVE THE READING OF THE MINUTES OF MEETING #9-2001 HELD ON MAY 29, 2001 AND ACCEPT THE MINUTES AS PRINTED.

MOVED AND SECONDED: TO WAIVE THE READING OF THE MINUTES OF MEETING #9-2001 HELD ON MAY 29, 2001 AND ACCEPT THE MINUTES AS PRINTED. (Councilors Beaulieu & Soley) (6 Ayes)

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS: Public Comment Period - 30 Minutes (Non-Agenda Items Only)

Councilor Mann read a letter from Brenda Timms who was unable to be in attendance tonight. She noted the lack of representation that West Freeport residents have experienced in the Growth Management Committee and that she has indicated an interest in participating in future studies.

Ann Hindley of Wardtown Road reviewed the billing provided by the Growth Management Project Consultant. Councilor Mann noted that he received this information but other Councilors had not. He distributed the information to Mrs. Hindley and asked her to review it and share the findings. She distributed copies to Councilors. She mentioned that the Town has already spent \$46,900 when

only \$46,500 was appropriated She had many questions that she hoped the Council would be able to provide answers to at a future meeting. Councilor Mann thanked Mrs. Hindley for the many hours she has spent trying to put this information into an orderly fashion. Councilor Stevens asked the Chair to make a request of the Town Manager to review the points raised and the material submitted by the Planner be reviewed as well to determine that we are not being over charged and that the charges are proper under the contract. This needs to be resolved in our favor with the consultant. Councilor Mann recommended that the product information regarding this contract be made available to members of the public in the Town Hall.

Joe Carroll of 38 Hunter Road noted that the Planning Board Workshop that took place a couple of weeks ago was not televised and had no minutes taken or no audio tape taken. The recommendation presented to the Planning Board was the same draft presented to the Council which included the Village Concept on February 28. At public hearings, Councilors recommended removing the Village Concept from the plan but when he brought this fact up, there was a lot of shuffling around and he was told it was an administrative error. Councilor Mann noted that the Council had left direction to televise the meeting but that person was sent home. Mr. Olmstead suggested that the Planning Board invite Councilors in for discussion. Councilor Mann suggested that the Council invite the Planning Board back and clear up the confusion that exists. Chair Arsenault agreed to discuss this at the next meeting.

Jerry Timms of Richards Lane noted that the Planning Workshop does not have to be televised but it should be open to the public. He doesn't understand how the Town could pay \$20,000 to a consultant without any itemization. Chair Arsenault did not know this to be true. Mr. Timms advised that they filed their third petition but they still haven't gotten it back. Mr. Olmstead explained that the third petition satisfies Maine law and they should have it by Thursday or Friday of this week. Councilor Mann asked that a statement be included stating that it is constitutionally correct.

MOVED AND SECONDED: To close the Public Comment Period (Councilors Soley & Beaulieu) (6Ayes).

BE IT ORDERED: That the June 5, 2001 Consent Agenda be adopted. (Soley & Stevens)

Councilor Beaulieu explained that she has a process issue on one of the items and will be voting no.

ROLL CALL VOTE: (5 Ayes) 1 Nay—Beaulieu).

ITEM #87-01

To consider action relative to proposed amendments to the Directional Sign Ordinance (Chapter 24).

BE IT ORDERED: That a Public Hearing be scheduled for June 19, 2001 at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall Council Chambers to discuss proposed amendments to the Directional Sign Ordinance.

<u>BE IT FURTHER ORDERED:</u> That 30 copies be distributed equally between the Town Clerk's office and the Freeport Community Library for inspection by citizens. (Beaulieu & Stevens) <u>ROLL CALL VOTE:</u> (6 Ayes).

ITEM #88-01

To consider action relative to authorizing the Freeport Recreation Committee to apply, on behalf of the Town, for federal financing assistance under the provisions of the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act, Public Law 88-578 for the development of the Freeport Recreation Site playground; and further authorize the Freeport Recreation Committee to enter into the Land and Water Conservation Fund Project Agreement with the State subsequent to federal approval of the project.

<u>BE IT ORDERED</u>: That the Freeport Town Council authorize the Recreation Committee to apply, on behalf of the Town, for federal financing assistance under the provisions of the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act, Public law 88-578 for the development of the Freeport Recreation Site playground; and further authorize the Freeport Recreation Committee to enter into the Land and Water Conservation Fund Project Agreement with the State subsequent to federal approval of the project.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED: That the appropriation of local funds are contingent upon approval of federal funds.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED: That the Recreation Committee Town Treasurer is authorized to borrow the necessary funds from time to time to cover anticipated federal reimbursement contingent upon approval of Federal funds. from fund balance. (Stevens & Soley)

John Hoy of Harvey Brook Drive explained that he needs a signed letter from the Council to apply for the Funds. Councilor Mann, Councilor Beaulieu and Jerry Timms had questions for Mr. Hoy which were addressed. The application needs to be mailed by the end of the month. Mr. Lyman assured Councilors that there would not be any impact to the recreation field by the playground addition.

MOVED AND SECONDED: To replace the words "Recreation Committee" with "Town Treasurer" and remove "contingent upon approval of Federal funds" and add "from fund balance". (Soley & Stevens) (6 Ayes).

Councilor Mann requested a copy of the application and Mr. Hoy agreed.

ROLL CALL VOTE ON AMENDED MOTION: (6 Ayes)

The certificate will be signed on June 19.

ITEM #89-01

To consider action relative to providing Freeport Community Services, Inc. with a guarantee of up to \$50,000 of indebtedness.

BE IT ORDERED: That the Town Manager is authorized to enter into an agreement with Bath Savings Institution and Freeport Community Services, Inc., whereby the Town will guarantee up to \$50,000 of the indebtedness to Bath Savings Institution incurred by Freeport Community Services, Inc. in connection with the acquisition and development of the proposed new Freeport Community Center, upon such terms as are acceptable to the Town Manager and subject to approval of the form of the guaranty agreement by the Town Attorney. (Lowell & Stevens).

Beth Finlayson of Freeport Community Services explained that they purchased 181 Lower Main Street to develop into a Community Center. They have received a proposal from Bath Savings to pay off the purchase before June 20, 2001. They are hoping the Townspeople will support a bond in the fall. Mr. Olmstead explained that the bank needs collateral before going forward. Discussion followed.

MOVED AND SECONDED TO AMEND:

- 1. The guarantee amount shall be \$50k or 10% of the total loan, whichever is lower.
- 2. The guarantee amount shall be an absolute cap. It cannot be increased by interest, penalties, costs, or fees.
- 3. The guarantee is not triggered until the lender has exhausted its recourse against all other borrowers and guarantors.
- 4. The Town shall have the right and option to occupy at least 10% of the space in the Community building.
- 5. We will retain a commercial real estate finance attorney to protect our interest in this matter. (Soley & Stevens)

Councilor Mann clarified that this is basically an interim package and Ms. Finlayson agreed. Harry Blumenthal, Board Chairman of Freeport Community Services agreed to the amendments noting that they appear to be reasonable.

VOTE: (6 Ayes)

ROLL CALL VOTE: (6 Ayes)

ITEM #90-01 To consider action relative to a proposed extension to the Moratorium on processing applications for major subdivisions.

BE IT ORDERED: That a Public Hearing be scheduled for June 19, 2001 at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall Council chambers to discuss the proposed extension of the Moratorium on processing applications for major subdivisions.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED: That 30 copies be distributed equally between the Town Clerk's office and the Freeport Community Library for inspection by citizens. (Mann & Stevens)

Councilor Mann asked about limitations and asked Councilor Stevens to check into this.

ROLL CALL VOTE: (6 Ayes).

To consider action relative to the Regional Vocational Budget as approved by the Cooperative Board for the year 2001-02.

BE IT ORDERED: That the Regional Vocational Budget as approved by the Cooperative Board for the year 2001-02 be approved in the amount of \$1,736,505, that \$223,135 be appropriated as Freeport's local share, and that \$24,171 be appropriated for the State share of debt service. (Soley & Beaulieu) ROLL CALL VOTE; (6 Ayes).

TTEM #92-01 To consider action relative to the Regional Vocational Budget as approved by the Cooperative Board for Adult Education for the year 2001-02.

BE IT ORDERED: That the Regional Vocational Budget as approved by the Cooperative Board for the year 2001-02 be approved in the amount of \$52,000 and that \$3,304 be appropriated as Freeport's local share. (Beaulieu & Stevens) ROLL CALL VOTE: (6 Ayes).

ITEM #93-01 To consider action relative to an appropriation from the Foundation Allocation for school purposes.

<u>BE IT ORDERED:</u> That \$7,984,264 be appropriated from the Foundation Allocation for school purposes and the \$7.062,796, be appropriated as Freeport's local share of the Foundation Allocation. (Stevens & Lowell) <u>ROLL CALL VOTE</u>: (6 Ayes).

ITEM #94-01 To consider action relative to an appropriation from Debt Service Allocation for school purposes.

<u>BE IT ORDERED:</u> That \$813,990, be appropriated from Debt Service Allocation for school purposes and that \$390,800 be appropriated as the local share of debt service. (Lowell & Soley) <u>ROLL CALL VOTE:</u> (6 Ayes).

ITEM #95-01 To consider action relative to waiving the policy regarding Tax Rate Increases.

<u>BE IT ORDERED:</u> That the policy regarding tax rate increases be waived to provide for an increase greater than the rate of inflation. (Mann & Soley)

Councilor Mann explained his reasons for voting no on the overall budget. Councilor Soley shared his views as well.
