2. Discussion on request to waive disposal fees at the landfill.

Mr. Olmstead pointed out that a letter has been received from One Freeport Place regarding a dump fee waiver for approximately four pick-up loads of brush, fallen tress and debris. He estimates the cost would be between \$50-\$80 for all four loads. Their western property line is adjacent to the Freeport High School parking lot. No one was in attendance to speak to this issue. A discussion followed. Chair Soley suggested leaving this matter to the Town Manager. The Council will have to trust the neighborhood to pay if the items are from private property and the Town will pay for the material that is taken from public property. Other Councilors concurred.

3. Discussion on Cable Board recommendations concerning the INET infrastructure.

Steve McPheters had handouts for Councilors and introduced representatives from Casco Cable. They are recommending that Freeport not go with the Franchise Agreement's specifications for the I-NET. They are recommending that Freeport go with what Casco terms the Private Virtual Network (PVN). Discussion followed. Chair Soley suggested authorizing the Town Manager and the Town Attorney to investigate coverage options and come back to the Council with recommendations.

MOVED AND SECONDED: To take up an item not on the printed agenda (Councilors Beaulieu & Arsenault) (6 Ayes) (1 Excused-Campbell).

MOVED AND SECONDED: That the Town Manager be authorized to spend up to \$15,000 On getting the new PVN system up and running from the Cable Reserve Fund. Casco Cable will draft the amendment and the Town Attorney will review it. (Councilors Beaulieu & Arsenault) (6 Ayes) (1 Excused-Campbell).

MOVED AND SECONDED: To_adjourn at (Councilors Arsenault & Beaulieu) (6 Ayes) (1 Excused-Campbell).

Municipal Budget Adopted FY 00

To The Town Council and Citizens of Freeport:

The following is a summary of the Fiscal Year 2000 budget. It should be noted that this budget has undergone significant cuts since initially presented to me by Department Heads and, of course, is subject to further revisions by the Town Council before final adoption. Board and Committee Budgets have not been reviewed by me and are subject to review by the Town Council.

Much of the budget increase throughout departments is due to inflationary costs. In that regard, this message will not deal with every change but will touch on some of the more extraordinary ones.

The Town Council did not give departments specific instructions on an approach to this year's budget process. After three budget workshops with the School Committee, a majority of the Town Council supported developing budget requests assuming a 3% tax increase. Municipal administrators presented budget requests based on that assumption.

Revenues:

Assuming a 3% increase in the tax rate and new value totaling 5 million dollars, \$465,000 in new tax revenue will be generated. In addition, non-property tax revenues will increase by \$114,000 due to increases in State Revenue Sharing and motor vehicle excise taxes.

Expenditures:

There are several budgetary needs to be highlighted. The Town needs to fund a Browntail Moth Spray Program. In Fiscal Year 99, \$30,000 was budgeted from Miscellaneous and Contingency to deal with the problem. In this budget, \$20,000 is proposed for Fiscal Year 2000. The State has informed us that this expenditure may be needed for several years to come.

A new equipment operator is proposed for the Public Works Department. The Department has not added any full time positions since the early 1970's. Since that time many new roads have been built and accepted by the Town. The miles of roads maintained per employee in Freeport far exceed our neighboring communities. The Department intends to request an additional employee in the Fiscal Year 2001 Budget as well.

The Solid Waste/Recycling Budget increases are the result of additional staffing needs to operate the Trash Collection container that will be installed at the facility this summer. The Town Council voted to give Freeport residents an additional option for the collection and transportation of residential waste. There are also significant increases in the water testing account and the cost of disposing of demolition materials.

Other Budget Components:

There is very good news to report concerning the County Tax Bill and Debt Service.

Debt Service:

The Town will retire several large bonds this year resulting in a decrease in debt payments of more than \$143,000.

County Tax:

Freeport's County Tax bill has declined for the first time in many years. Through the use of State Tax Increment Financing (TIF) laws, the Town Council has protected value from the State formulas used to determine such expenses and revenues as the County Tax Bill, State Aid to Education and Municipal Revenue Sharing. Revenues captured from TIF Districts will be used to promote diversity and fund capital projects.
