WHEREAS, the number of peddlers and itinerant vendors setting up stands, booths, push carts and similar devices on private property within the Town of Freeport has increased substantially over the past several years; and

WHEREAS, that increased activity has sometimes resulted in obstructions of pedestrian and vehicular traffic, has sometimes created nuisance conditions and, if left unregulated, is detrimental to the public order and public safety; and

WHEREAS, the Town currently regulates some peddlers through Chapter 43 of the Freeport Code, but Chapter 43 applies only to peddlers selling on public streets or from public places; and

WHEREAS, regulation of peddlers on private property presents unique problems and concerns; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has instructed the Planning Board to prepare and recommend a proposed ordinance governing peddlers on private property; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, until the Planning Board has prepared and the Town Council has had an opportunity to review and enact an appropriate ordinance governing peddlers on private property, it is necessary to avoid the proliferation of peddlers on private property;

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the season during which peddlers operate will begin before a moratorium ordinance could be enacted pursuant to the ordinance enactment procedure of Sec. 2.12 (b) of the Charter of the Town of Freeport, allowing peddlers to begin operations before the effective date, thereby resulting in the obstruction of pedestrian and vehicular traffic & nuisance conditions which the moratorium is intended to prevent; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council declares that the foregoing facts constitute a public emergency affecting the public peace and requiring the enactment of an emergency ordinance pursuant to Sec. 2.13 of the Charter of the Town of Freeport;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town of Freeport hereby ordains as follows:

1). Peddler on Private Property defined. "Peddler on Private Property" means any person who does business by selling objects, wares, goods, food, beverages, services, tangible commodities or other things of value at any location on private property other than a fixed place of business.

2). Fixed Place of Business defined. "Fixed Place of Business" means any building or other permanently affixed structure located on private property in compliance with or lawfully existing pursuant to the Freeport Zoning Ordinance.

3). Person defined. "Person" means any natural person, corporation, trust, partnership, incorporated or unincorporated association or any other legal entity, but does not include bona fide charitable, service, religious or municipal organizations or agencies, or organizations or agencies, or organizations sponsored by the Fourth of July Committee or its successor.

4). Peddlers on Private Property Prohibited. During the term of this Ordinance, no Peddler on Private Property shall do business within the Town of Freeport.

5). Exemption. This Ordinance shall not prevent a person who did business as a Peddler on Private Property in the Town of Freeport during the calendar year 1991 from resuming that business in the same location, provided such person demonstrates to the satisfaction of the (Town Clerk) that he did business in that location in 1991. The determination of the (Town Clerk) that a person is or is not exempt under this paragraph shall be final. Any applicant who has filed with the Town Clerk for a Victualer's License for a peddler on private property on or before March 3, 1992, shall be exempt from the moratorium provision.

6). Term of Ordinance. This Emergency Ordinance shall take effect upon enactment and shall remain in effect for 60 days, unless otherwise extended, modified or repealed by the Freeport Town Council.
