YES 1,852 NO 1,066

3,110 ballots were cast amounting to 56% of registered voters casting a ballot. District 1 had 52% voter turnout. District 2 had 53% voter turnout. District 3 had 55% voter turnout. District 4 had 64% voter turnout. There were 171 absentee ballots broken down as follows: District 1-38 ballots, District 2-41 ballots, District 3-47 ballots and District 4-45 ballots.

DISTRICT 4 HAD 64% VOTER TURNOUT. THERE WERE 171 ABSENTEE BALLOTS BROKEN DOWN AS FOLLOWS: DISTRICT 1- 38 BALLOTS, DISTRICT 2- 41 BALLOTS, DISTRICT 3- 47 BALLOTS AND DISTRICT 4- 45 BALLOTS.
